Grade 4

An extract is played containing 1 cadence. Identify perfect, and imperfect cadences in major and minor keys.

Grade 5

An extract is played containing 1 cadence. Identify perfect, imperfect, and interrupted cadences in major and minor keys.

Grade 6

An extract is played containing 1 cadence. Identify perfect, plagal, imperfect, and interrupted cadences in major keys.

Grade 7

An extract is played containing 1 cadence. Identify authentic/perfect, plagal, half/imperfect, and deceptive/interrupted cadences in minor keys.

CHORD RECOGNITION

Grade 3

Identify the triad as major or minor.

INTERVAL RECOGNITION

Grade 3

Perfect 4ths, 5ths, Major 2nds, 3rds, Minor 3rds - identify the interval formed by the first 2 notes of the melody.

Grade 4

Perfect 4ths, 5ths, unison, Major 2nds, 3rds, 6ths, Minor 2nds, 3rds, 6ths, - identify the interval formed by the first 2 notes of the melody.

Grade 5

Perfect 4ths, 5ths, Octaves, unison, Major 2nds, 3rds, 6ths, 7ths, Minor 2nds, 3rds, 6ths, 7ths.

MELODIC COMPARISON

Grade 1

Highlight the altered pitches. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 2/4, or 3/4 time, and contain scale degrees - 7 to 5 in major keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 1 pitch altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 3 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 3 #s and bs.

Grade 2

Highlight the altered pitches. Melodies will be 8 bars long in 2/4, or 3/4 time, and contain scale degrees - 7 to 5 in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 1 pitch altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 3 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 3 #s and bs.

Grade 3

Highlight the altered pitches. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 4/4, or 3/4 time, and contain all scale degrees in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 1 pitch altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 3 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 3 #s and bs.

Grade 4

Notate the changed melody. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 4/4, or 6/8 time, and contain all scale degrees in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 1 pitch altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 32 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 3 #s and bs.

Grade 5

Notate the changed melody. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, or 6/8 time, and contain all scale degrees in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 2 pitches altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 53 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 4 #s and bs.

Grade 6

Notate the changed melody. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, 4/4, or 6/8 time, and contain all scale degrees in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 2 pitches altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 53 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 4 #s and bs.

Grade 7

Notate the changed melody. Melodies will be 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, 4/4, or 6/8 time, and contain all scale degrees in major and minor keys, with a maximum interval of a 5th. There will be 3 pitches altered by a maximum of a major 2nd, and level 53 rhythmic values will be used. Key signatures with up to 5 #s and bs.

METER RECOGNITION

Grade 1

Melodic extracts of 4 bars in 2/4, 3/4, including eighth notes, quarter notes, dotted half notes, half notes.

Grade 2

Melodic extracts of 4 bars in 2/4, 3/4, including eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, quarter notes, dotted half notes, half notes.

Grade 3

Melodic extracts of 8 bars in 2/4, 3/4, including eighth notes, quarter notes, dotted quarter notes, dotted half notes, and half notes.

Grade 4

Melodic extracts of 4 bars in 4/4, 6/8, including, eighth notes, quarter notes, dotted quarter notes, dotted half notes, and half notes.

Grade 5

Melodic extracts in 2/4, 4/4, 6/8, including sixteenth notes, eighth notes, dotted eighth notes, quarter notes, dotted quarter notes, dotted half notes, and half notes.

MODULATION

Grade 5

Major - Relative Minor, Minor - Relative Major. Select the modulation type. Starting key - up to 3 #s or bs.

Grade 6

Major Tonic - Dominant, Major Tonic - Subdominant, Major - Relative Minor. Select the modulation type or identify new key center. Starting key - up to 4 #s or bs.

Grade 7

Minor - Relative Major, Minor tonic - Minor subdominant, Minor - Dominant of the Relative Major. Select the modulation type or identify new key center. Starting key - up to 5 #s and bs.

PITCH COMPARISON

Initial

Identify whether the 2nd note is higher, lower, or the same as the first note.

Grade 1

Compare the first and last notes of a 4 bar melody.

Grade 2

Compare the first and last notes of a 4 bar melody.

PULSE TAPPING

Grade 2

Tap the pulse of melodic extracts in 2/4 and 3/4, containing dotted half notes, half notes, dotted eighth notes, eighth notes, and sixteenth notes.

Grade 3

Tap the pulse of melodic extracts in 4/4 and 3/4, containing dotted half notes, half notes, dotted quarter notes, quarter notes, and eighth notes.

Grade 4

Tap the pulse of melodic extracts in 4/4 and 6/8, containing dotted half notes, half notes, dotted quarter notes, quarter notes, eighth notes.

RHYTHM COMPARISON

Grade 2

Highlight the altered rhythmic values. Extracts will be melodic, and 8 bars long in 2/4, or 3/4 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, and dotted half notes.

Grade 3

Highlight the altered rhythmic values. Extracts will be melodic, and 4 bars long in 4/4, or 3/4 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, or dotted half notes. 1 bar of the extract will be rhythmically altered.

Grade 4

Notate the altered rhythm. Extracts will be melodic, and 4 bars long in 4/4, or 6/8 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, or dotted half notes. 1 bar of the extract will be rhythmically altered.

Grade 5

Notate the altered rhythm. Extracts will be melodic, and 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, or 6/8 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, sixteenth notes, dotted eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, or dotted half notes. 1 bar of the extract will be rhythmically altered.

Grade 6

Notate the altered rhythm. Extracts will be melodic, and 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, 4/4 or 6/8 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, sixteenth notes, dotted eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, or dotted half notes. 1 bar of the extract will be rhythmically altered.

Grade 7

Notate the altered rhythm. Extracts will be melodic, and 4 bars long in 2/4, 3/4, 4/4 or 6/8 time. They may contain half notes, quarter notes, eighth notes, sixteenth notes, dotted eighth notes, dotted quarter notes, or dotted half notes. 1 bar of the extract will be rhythmically altered.

Initial

Imitate 2 bar melodic extracts in 2/4, containing half notes, quarter notes and eighth notes.

Grade 1

Imitate 2 bar melodic extracts in 2/4 and 3/4, containing dotted half notes, half notes, quarter notes, and eighth notes.
